RESOLUTION NO. 2020-03

EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY AND RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY BY THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO

- WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California proclaimed on March 4, 2020, a State of Emergency to exist in California as a result of the threat from the rapid spread of a respiratory illness caused by novel coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19); and
- WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, the County of El Dorado Public Health Officer declared a Local Public Health Emergency in response to COVID-19, which was ratified by the County Board of Supervisors on March 17, 2020; and
- WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, the Director of the Office of Emergency Services of El Dorado County, proclaimed a Local Emergency based on conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of the County of El Dorado as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; which was ratified by the County Board of Supervisors on March 17, 2020; and
- WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States issued a proclamation declaring the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States as a national emergency, beginning March 1, 2020; and
- WHEREAS, the El Dorado Hills County Water District President of the Board of Directors or his/her designee, may declare a state of local disaster emergency within El Dorado Hills County Water District. Such declaration shall be based on the judgment that a state of local disaster emergency is necessary to deal with a current or imminent emergency/disaster situation; and
- WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within the District's boundaries, caused by natural, technological or human-caused disasters; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Board of Directors does hereby find that the COVID-19 pandemic has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, requiring the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat, and desires to proclaim a local emergency and ratify the proclamation of local emergency by the County of El Dorado.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Proclamation of Local Emergency</u>. The Board hereby declares a local health emergency and taking the action herein and proclaims that a local emergency now exists throughout the District.

Section 3. Ratification of County of El Dorado Proclamation. The Board hereby ratifies the County of El Dorado's Proclamation of Local Health Emergency and Proclamation of Local Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 17, 2020. The Board hereby ratifies the Order of the Health Officer of the County of El Dorado dated March 12, 2020.

Section 4. <u>Necessary Acts</u>. The Fire Chief or designee is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, without limitation, request any available funding from the California Disaster Assistance Act, the Small Business Administration, State and Federal government, and/or any other funding available as a result of this proclamation and ratification of local emergency. During the existence of this local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the District shall be prescribed by federal, state and local law, and by the District's ordinances, resolutions and regulations.

The Fire Chief or his designee is hereby authorized to take the necessary steps within his authority as Fire Chief of the El Dorado Hills Fire Department, and within the operational area or mutual aid area of the District, to carry out any law, order, regulation, or legal directive issued by the federal, state, or local government, including any applicable provisions of the California Emergency Services Act (Cal Government Code §8550 et. Seq.), the California Office of Emergency Services Emergency Plan, the California Department of Public Health, the Centers for Disease Control and any other local State of Emergency Plan or Proclamation which provides direction to local fire and rescue agencies or districts.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date of Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until terminated by the Board of Directors.

Cal OES Form 130 Instructions

A Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies is required of all Applicants to be eligible to receive funding. A new resolution must be submitted if a previously submitted Resolution is older than three (3) years from the last date of approval, is invalid or has not been submitted.

When completing the Cal OES Form 130, Applicants should fill in the blanks on page 1. The blanks are to be filled in as follows:

Resolution Section:

Governing Body: This is the group responsible for appointing and approving the Authorized Agents. Examples include: Board of Directors, City Council, Board of Supervisors, Board of Education, etc.

Name of Applicant: The public entity established under the laws of the State of California. Examples include: School District, Office of Education, City, County or Non-profit agency that has applied for the grant, such as: City of San Diego, Sacramento County, Burbank Unified School District, Napa County Office of Education, University Southern California.

Authorized Agent: These are the individuals that are authorized by the Governing Body to engage with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Governor's Office of Emergency Services regarding grants applied for by the Applicant. There are two ways of completing this section:

- 1. Titles Only: If the Governing Body so chooses, the titles of the Authorized Agents would be entered here, not their names. This allows the document to remain valid (for 3 years) if an Authorized Agent leaves the position and is replaced by another individual in the same title. If "Titles Only" is the chosen method, this document must be accompanied by a cover letter naming the Authorized Agents by name and title. This cover letter can be completed by any authorized person within the agency and does not require the Governing Body's signature.
- 2. Names and Titles: If the Governing Body so chooses, the names and titles of the Authorized Agents would be listed. A new Cal OES Form 130 will be required if any of the Authorized Agents are replaced, leave the position listed on the document or their title changes.

Governing Body Representative: These are the names and titles of the approving Board Members.

Examples include: Chairman of the Board, Director, Superintendent, etc. The names and titles cannot be one of the designated Authorized Agents, and a minimum of two or more approving board members need to be listed.

Certification Section:

Name and Title: This is the individual that was in attendance and recorded the Resolution creation and approval. Examples include: City Clerk, Secretary to the Board of Directors, County Clerk, etc. This person cannot be one of the designated Authorized Agents or Approving Board Member (if a person holds two positions such as City Manager and

Secretary to the Board and the City Manager is to be listed as an Authorized Agent, then the same person holding the Secretary position would sign the document as Secretary to the Board (not City Manager) to eliminate "Self Certification."
