I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice President Winn called the meeting to order at 6:06 p.m. and Chief Roberts led the Pledge of Allegiance. Directors in attendance: Barber, Hidahl and Winn. Director Hartley attended via teleconference. (President Durante was absent). Staff in attendance: Chief Roberts, Deputy Chief O’Camb and Chief Financial Officer Bair. Counsel Cook was also in attendance.

II. CONSENT CALENDAR

A. Approve minutes of the 697th meeting held August 22, 2013

B. Approve Financial Statements for August 2013

Director Hidahl made a motion to approve the Consent Calendar, seconded by Director Barber and unanimously carried.

III. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS

A. EDH Professional Firefighters – Matt Beckett, President of the Professional Firefighters, addressed the Board stating that an MOU has been agreed upon and will be presented to the Board for approval in Closed Session.

B. EDH Firefighters Association – Neil Hillel, Treasurer of the El Dorado Hills Firefighters Association, reported on the success of the recent Golf Tournament held at Serrano County Club and the Wine, Cheese and Brew Grand Finale.

V. ATTORNEY ITEMS – None

VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Administrative Committee (Directors Barber and Hidahl)

1. Review and update on construction progress of Station 84 – Chief O’Camb stated that approval of an easement allowing legal access to the south side of Station 84 had finally been received. In addition, plans have been submitted for the building permit. The Request for Proposal process is scheduled for the December timeframe with construction beginning shortly after.

Chief O’Camb also stated that the Station 84 move to the new temporary facility went very smoothly; he emphasized that several thousand dollars have been saved by the crew’s efforts to be thrifty in salvaging items from the old Station 84 for use in the temporary station. In addition, Chief Niehues has been taking advantage of specialized training opportunities that the old station offers. Chief O’Camb said that it will be necessary to obtain a hazardous materials contractor to clean up an asbestos issue in the flooring in the mid-November timeframe. He stated that the generator, shed and other large items deemed surplus have been put up to bid.

B. Fire Committee (Directors Durante and Winn)

Vice President Winn stated that both Items B-1 and B-2 will be continued to the next Board meeting.

C. Ad Hoc Committee Reports

- 1. Report from the Regional Operations Committee regarding annexation of Latrobe, Rescue and Diamond Springs/El Dorado Protection District - (Directors Hartley and Barber) – Chief Roberts updated the Board on the progress of the Latrobe annexation stating that the Associated Firefighters have approved the “White Paper” document.**

Director Barber made a motion to authorize Staff to move forward in the annexation process as well as give direction to Counsel Cook to draft a resolution supporting the “White Paper” as amended. The motion was seconded by Director Hidahl and unanimously carried.

Chief Roberts stated that a few months ago a meeting was held after having received a letter from the Rescue Fire Department and the Diamond Springs/El Dorado Protection District requesting the opportunity to explore the feasibility of annexation with the El Dorado Hills Fire Department. Discussions continued with Rescue Fire and subsequently, the announcement of Chief O’Camb’s retirement presented a mutually beneficial opportunity for Rescue and El Dorado Hills Fire Departments to share resources. Chief Roberts proposed that Chief Keating of the Rescue Fire Department assume some of Chief O’Camb’s responsibilities in an Administrative Chief role at no cost to the El Dorado Hills Fire Department in exchange for shift/battalion chief coverage, prevention and training support to the Rescue Fire Department. Chief Roberts stated that this job sharing agreement would be for a six month trial period.

Director Barber made a motion to give Staff direction to draft a six month resource sharing agreement between the Rescue Fire Department and the El Dorado Hills Fire Department beginning October 1, 2013. The motion was seconded by Director Hidahl and unanimously carried.

Richard Ross, El Dorado Hills Fire Department, commented that he would like an explanation as to why the annexations under consideration would be beneficial to El Dorado Hills taxpayers.

Matt Beckett, President of the El Dorado Hills Professional Firefighters, asked that there be continued opportunity for involvement at the committee level for future discussions regarding perspective annexations.

2. **Commission for Collaborative Fire Departments (CCFD formerly League of Fire Districts)** (Directors Hartley and Hidahl) – Director Hidahl stated that a meeting has been scheduled with the Board of Supervisors on September 24 to approve funding of the “patch”, a two-year temporary solution targeted to keep the underfunded Districts solvent until a longer term solution can be put in place by adjusting AB-8 funding. All Board members are encouraged to attend this meeting.
3. **Report from Human Resources Committee** (Directors Durante and Winn) – Director Winn reported that the committee has not met yet but will meet soon.

The meeting adjourned to Closed Session at 6:42 p.m. to discuss Item VI.C-4 as follows:

The meeting reconvened at 7:42 p.m. Vice President Winn reported that during Closed Session, no action was taken. This item will be continued to next Board meeting.

5. **Report from Ad Hoc Budget and Negotiations Committee (Directors Hidahl and Winn)** – Director Hidahl stated that a meeting will need to be scheduled for the Budget and Negotiations Committee as soon as possible.

6. **Review and approve Memorandum of Understanding with EDH Associated Firefighters and other non-represented groups** – Discussion will be moved to next Board meeting.

VII. OPERATIONS REPORT

- A. **Operations Report** - Received and filed.

- B. **Review and update regarding Joint Powers Authority** – Chief Roberts gave an update stating that several unexpected, one time payments helped contribute to a balanced budget this year. He also stated that Cameron Park, El Dorado County Fire and El Dorado Hills Fire had each submitted a Request for Information to be considered for taking over the JPA’s operation; however, El Dorado County Fire and Cameron Park Fire had not included an essential supervisory management component. Chief Roberts also commented that the County is still waiting to hear from the State as to who holds the 201 Rights (exclusive operating area rights for ambulance service) in El Dorado County.

- C. **Review and discuss surplus of Truck 8591 and discuss options for sale** – Chief O’Camb reported that there has been no interest shown on bidding for the sale of Truck 8591. He recommended placing Truck 8591 in surplus status and selling it on consignment..

Director Hidahl made a motion to approve Truck 8591 for surplus and place it on consignment for sale using the best vendor available, seconded by Director Barber and unanimously carried.

- D. **Review and approve stipend for strike team for Chief O’Camb** – The Board reviewed Staff’s recommendation that Chief O’Camb be awarded additional compensation of \$8,400 for the O.E.S. Strike Team assignment as Strike Team Leader on the Rim Wildland Fire.

Director Barber made a motion to approve Staff’s recommendation of additional compensation of \$8,400 for the O.E.S. Strike Team assignment, seconded by Director Hidahl, and unanimously carried.

- E. **Review and discuss possibility of job sharing with Rescue Fire Protection District** - Previously discussed.

VIII. FISCAL ITEMS

- A. Public Hearing – Review and approve Resolution 2013-07 adopting the Appropriation Limits for fiscal year 2013/14** – Director Hidahl reviewed the appropriation limits for the 2013/14 fiscal year in the sum of \$28,878,000 and asked for Board approval of Resolution 2013-07.

Director Hidahl made a motion to approve Resolution 2013-07 adopting the appropriation limits of \$28,878,000 for the 2013-14 fiscal year, seconded by Director Barber, and unanimously carried. (Roll Call: Ayes: All; Noes: None; Absent: Director Durante).

- B. Public Hearing – Review and approve Resolution 2013-08, approving the Final Budget for fiscal year 2013/14 and authorizing expenditures from Reserve Funds** – CFO Bair highlighted the changes that were made to the Final Budget and asked for Board approval as well as authorizing expenditures from Reserve Fund. She commented that the Property Tax revenue was anticipated to come in at 1.0 percent but actually came in at almost 1.5 percent.

Director Hidahl made a motion to approve Resolution 2013-08, approving the Final Budget for fiscal year 2013/14 and authorizing expenditures from Reserve Funds, seconded by Director Winn and unanimously carried. (Roll Call: Ayes: All; Noes: None; Absent: Director Durante.)

Richard Ross, El Dorado Hills resident, asked the Board for clarification of the budget and reserve numbers to which Director Hidahl responded.

- XI. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS** - The Directors expressed their gratitude to those volunteers that worked hard to make the EDH Firefighters Association's Wine, Cheese and Brew Grand Finale a success. Chief Roberts commended the Lake Hills Fire Safe Council on achieving their Firewise Community status as well as receiving a \$48,000 grant. He also stated that six candidates had passed the Battalion Chief testing and appointments will be made soon. Chief Roberts announced that the crew was honored today in Folsom for their lifesaving measures that led to the revival and full recovery of a youth that had drowned. Chief O'Camb said he and two others will be traveling to Pennsylvania on October 8 for a final inspection of the new engine. CFO Bair mentioned that a detailed budget is in the packet and posted online and that the Board Policy Manual has now been put in its proper format and distributed.

XII. ADJOURNMENT

Director Hidahl made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Director Barber, and unanimously carried.

**EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT
RESOLUTION 2013-09
RESOLUTION ADOPTING DEVELOPMENT FEES**

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the El Dorado Hills County Water District recognizes that continuing development within the District places added responsibilities and costs upon the Fire District; and

WHEREAS, new development will enjoy the benefits of existing facilities and equipment and will result in the need for additional facilities and equipment to maintain existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, the District's Annual Report and the annually adopted Five Year Plan provide, among other things, a report regarding existing facilities and equipment, call loads and response times, and a projection of future growth, the impacts associated therewith, and the facilities and equipment, which in the professional opinion of the District, will be necessary to serve projected growth while maintaining existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, existing levels of service within the District are measured, among other ways, in terms of emergency response times, firefighter to population ratios, facility and apparatus capacities and capabilities, training and readiness standards, and the types and quality of services provided; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain existing levels of service, new development must contribute development fees toward the cost of acquiring additional facilities and equipment necessary to mitigate the impacts of growth and maintain the existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 66000 et. seq., and El Dorado County Ordinance No. 3391 allow the District to impose development fees to mitigate the impacts of new development; and

WHEREAS, since 1987, the District has collected development fees as a necessary element of its financial ability to serve the needs of a growing District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the financial plans and facilities plans of the District, including the Five Year Plan adopted October 17, 2013, and the staff report pertaining hereto, and has determined it to be necessary to continue the collection of said fees in the amount set forth hereinbelow; and

WHEREAS, the Board provided an opportunity for public comment upon the Five Year Plan at its August 2013 Board of Directors Meeting, and at this meeting and has conducted a public hearing as required by law prior to adopting the Development Fees contemplated hereby; and

WHEREAS, after considering input from District staff and the public and the information contained in the Annual Report and the Five Year Plan, and based upon the experience

and judgment of members of the Board of Directors, the District hereby adopts the following resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there be continued in effect a development fee as a condition of any building permit for the development of any residential, commercial, institutional, or industrial use within the El Dorado Hills County Water District.

Section 1. Definitions.

"Residential Use" means any use for residential purposes, including agricultural uses with a residence, as defined in the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

"Commercial/Industrial Use" means any use for commercial or industrial purposes as defined in the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

"Institutional Use" means any use for charitable, educational, hospital, church purposes, to the extent such use is not also considered as agricultural, commercial, residential, or industrial under the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

Section 2. Development Fee Amount.

Residential: \$1.16 per square foot

Commercial, Industrial,
Institutional Buildings: \$1.16 per square foot

Section 3. Credit for Fees Paid. If Mitigation Fees were previously paid to the District by the developer or his predecessor for parcel splits within the District, the fee herein described shall be waived up to the amount previously paid.

Section 4. Determination of Fee. The development fee as defined herein has been determined by totaling the District's projected cost of apparatus and facilities needs caused by new development, divided by the total projected square footage of residential, industrial, commercial and institutional building over the next five (5) years. The imposition of Development Impact fees upon a square footage basis is determined to be the most fair and accurate allocation of costs to be incurred to mitigate the impacts of growth, given the greater demands occasioned by larger structures due to, among other factors, greater combustible space, greater potential occupancies, greater fire flow requirements, and greater manpower and equipment requirements in emergency situations.

Section 5. Development Expenditures Limitations. The development fees collected by the El Dorado Hills County Water District shall be kept in a separate fund and used to provide additional facilities and equipment to maintain the existing levels of service within the District as detailed in the District's Five Year Plan; provided, however, funds collected from residential construction for facilities may only be used if an account has been established and funds appropriated for such and for which the District has adopted a proposed construction schedule or

plan or said fees are used to reimburse the District for expenditures previously made. The facilities, apparatus, equipment and fee methodology are more fully detailed in the District's Five-Year Plan, which is annually reviewed, updated and adopted by the District Board of Directors.

Section 6. Appeals. Any person may appeal the imposition of these development fees by filing a statement of appeal outlining the facts and circumstances which the appellant believes are sufficient to justify the waiver of development fees as applied to the appellant's property. The District's Board of Directors will consider the appeal at its next Board of Directors meeting scheduled not less than seventy-two (72) hours from and after receipt of the written appeal.

The foregoing resolution was duly passed and adopted by the Board of Directors of the El Dorado Hills County Water District at a meeting of said Board held on the 17th day of October, 2013 by the following vote:

Note: The target of a 6 minute response time to 90% of code 3 emergency calls (a lights and sirens, 911 emergency) was adopted by past administrations and Board of Directors based on NFPA 1710 guidelines. The NFPA 1710 sets these guidelines based on statistics that both fires and critical medical emergencies have the best outcome if contact is made within this time frame. Fire stations were strategically located throughout the District with this target in mind. It is important to note that there are several factors that can affect the 6 minute response target such as having to put on safety gear, responding to calls during the night or not being in quarters at the time of the call.

Request to Purchase Buddy Breather Manifolds from L. N. Curtis & Sons

Summary:

The Department previously purchased Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA's) that did not have the ability for a firefighter in an emergency to be able to share air with another firefighter. Drager makes a "buddy breather" attachment that allows this interconnection to occur. El Dorado Hills Fire Department SCBA Technicians are trained to install this missing component in-house.

A total of 60 Drager 40" Multilink Buddy Breather Manifolds are needed to outfit the Department's SCBA's. L. N. Curtis & Sons is the West Coast authorized vendor for Drager products.

Fiscal Impact:

This item was approved in the 2013/2014 Final Budget. The cost is \$24,445.50.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the purchase of 60 Drager 40" Multilink Buddy Breather Manifolds from L. N. Curtis.


