Re: Feasibility Study Related to Expanded Capabilities of Camino Emergency Command Center

Chief Estes,

As you are aware, the El Dorado Hills Fire Department seeks to enhance certain elements of the current communications system. Our motivation is threefold:

- Provide the means to track and report to our Board of Directors and Community our
  performance utilizing Deployment Measures covering the following response time segments:
  911 Call Handling Time, Turnout Time, Travel Time, Total Response Time, and Effective
  Response Force Time.
- 2. Remove any communication/dispatch delays with Folsom Fire Department, providing for a truly borderless response when dispatching across the County Line.
- 3. Provide for greater command and control of the incident utilizing repeated tactical channels and increased firefighter safety by including emergency evacuation alerting and emergency signal button notification.

It should be noted that if these system improvements are implemented there could be substantial benefit for the rest of the County Fire Departments and JPA Member agencies.

To accomplish our objectives, we have provided a list of eight (8) infrastructure enhancements that our organization is looking for:

- 1. "Push button" direct CAD link communication (Responding, At Scene, Returning, etc.)
- 2. Mapping system direct from a CAD push with hydrant overlays, pre-fire plan layer, etc.
- 3. Dispatching of closest resource using AVL (Automatic Vehicle Location) (GPS)

- 4. Simulcast or Voting Repeater System (no manual repeater selection)
- 5. Repeated Tactical Radio Channels (critical communications not missed)
- 6. Emergency Signal Button use on portable radio to Dispatch
- 7. Ability to have an evacuation tone on Tactical Channel
- 8. Folsom/EDH improved response through "CAD to CAD Transfer" with resources on both sides visible to each other's respective dispatch consoles

In the feasibility study, we would be looking for three questions to be answered on each of the eight requested enhancements. Those questions are:

- 1. Is it possible for Camino ECC and the JPA infrastructure to provide this enhancement?
- 2. What would the fully implemented cost be to provide the requested enhancement?
  - a. Costs breakdown should include all costs related to fully functional operation including but not limited to: Third-Party Costs related to testing, programming, engineering, design, and installation, all Required Hardware/Software costs, anticipated IT support, Radio Tech support, leasing costs, etc.
  - b. Costs should be broken into two categories:
    - i. One Time Costs
    - ii. Ongoing Costs
- 3. If fully funded by El Dorado Hills Fire Department, what is the estimated timeline for a fully functional implementation?

We recognize that this feasibility study request will take valuable staff time to accomplish, and we are willing to cover these additional costs. Please provide us with a total estimate related to completing this feasibility study, so that we can budget appropriately and gain approval for the expenditure from our Board of Directors.

If your organization does not have the capacity to perform this feasibility study, please provide us with your recommendation of a person/firm that can provide us with the information we need. We would be happy to separately contract with them.

We recognize that the El Dorado County Fire Chiefs Association and the JPA Board of Directors will have an interest in this request. We very much value our partnership with the other agencies in the County however, since we are willing to cover the full costs related to the feasibility study, and the full cost of implementation, we feel that it is appropriate for us to communicate directly with you. As always we will keep the other JPA Member Agencies informed regarding this process.

Furthermore, we are not locked into keeping the Apple Operating System (iOS) for communications if there is a solution that uses a different platform, although if required to switch those costs should also be included in the implementation plan. In total between apparatus and individual tablets we utilize 40 units.

We would appreciate a response regarding your ability to provide this study, or your recommendation of a person/firm able to provide this study by Feb  $24^{th}$  2017.

Re: SRPSCC JPA Feasibility Study to Provide Dispatch Services to El Dorado Hills Fire Department Greetings Teresa,

As you know, El Dorado Hills Fire Department has been very interested in improving safety for our Firefighters and providing a higher level of service to our Community since late 2013 when our Strategic Planning identified our County Communications System as a significant weakness in our emergency response structure. To explore improved emergency communications, we met with you and your staff several times regarding the possibility of your agency providing dispatch services for our Department. During those meetings, we found your staff to be very professional and knowledgeable regarding our communications challenges, but most importantly it was obvious that your team is top notch and dedicated to customer service, which is in line with our own mission and values.

On December 29, 2015, with my Board of Directors in full support, we submitted a letter to you and the (then) SRFECC Board of Directors requesting a feasibility study to explore our options and associated costs related to contracting with your agency for full dispatch and communications services. Unfortunately, at that time we did not get a majority vote to move forward with our request, and it was tabled while a policy was being developed that would set a defined path for agencies interested in a contract for dispatch and communications services.

We were very pleased that your policy (1.007 Qualifications for Status as a Contracting Agency of the SRPSCC) was adopted at your regular meeting of the SRPSCC Board on January 31, 2017. In anticipation of this, on January 30, 2017 I held a Board workshop with my Directors regarding deployment measure recommendations from a recent CITYGATE Community Risk Assessment and Standards of Cover study. During this meeting, we discussed how our current communications and dispatch functionality shortfalls were keeping us from achieving our desired goals. Subsequently, we identified the deficits of our current communications system, and developed three goals that would need to be accomplished to achieve our desired service level outcome.

- 1. Provide the means to track and report to our Board of Directors and Community our response time performance utilizing Deployment Measures covering the following time segments:
  - a. 911 Call Handling Time
  - b. Turnout Time
  - c. Travel Time
  - d. Total Response Time
  - e. Effective Response Force Time
- 2. With borders blurring between Folsom and El Dorado Hills, remove any communications/dispatch delays between our two agencies providing for a truly borderless/closest resource response when dispatching across the County Line.
- 3. Provide for greater command and control of the incident utilizing repeated tactical channels and increased firefighter safety by including emergency evacuation alerting and emergency signal button notification.

To achieve these three goals, we developed a list of 8 specific objectives, or essential items we felt were necessary for a robust Communications/Dispatch system:

- 1. Push Button direct CAD link communications (Responding, At Scene, etc.)
- 2. Mapping system direct from CAD push with hydrant overlay, pre-plan layer, etc.
- 3. Dispatching of closest resource using AVL
- 4. Simulcast or Voting repeater system (elimination of manual repeater selection errors)
- 5. Repeated tactical channels (critical fire ground communications not missed by incoming units)
- 6. Emergency signal button use on portable radio to Dispatch
- 7. Ability to have an evacuation tone on tactical channel
- 8. Folsom/EDH seamless dispatch/response across County Line

We believe that each of these objectives could be achieved by contracting for dispatch/communications with the SRPSCC.

It is important for the SRPSCC Board to know that in anticipation of this potential relationship we have already secured several critical items, some of which could be beneficial to both agencies:

- 1. 5 Repeated Pairs in the new 700 MHz Band have been reserved and licensed for EDHFD use. Additionally, repeater/antenna locations have been preliminarily secured throughout our district to accommodate the anticipated infrastructure.
- 2. El Dorado County Medical Director has pre-approved SRPSCC for EMD (Emergency Medical Dispatch) to El Dorado Hills 911 calls for service.
- 3. Money is already approved in our 2016/2017 FY budget to reimburse the SRPSCC for all costs related to providing us with a comprehensive feasibility study not to exceed \$25,000.00.
- 4. If approved by both agencies the timing is right. Completion of the feasibility study prior to our 2017/2018 FY budget preparation will allow us to budget for the required infrastructure improvements in the next fiscal year. All infrastructure improvements will be paid for by EDHFD.

- 5. We are currently in the process of developing a new Facilities Master Plan and Nexus study to set our development fees moving forward. Since this is a significant level of service improvement for our Community some of the infrastructure costs could be defrayed by development fees.
- 6. As a member agency, per conversations with Division Chief Wilson and Fire Chief Haverty Folsom Fire Department, has agreed to be our sponsor in this endeavor.

As you can see we continue to be very interested in the potential of contracting for dispatch/communications services with the SRPSCC. I believe that we share the same vision and values related to providing the highest quality emergency services to our customers, along with the highest standard of safety for our Firefighters.

Please use this letter as our official request to be considered for a feasibility study performed by the SRPSCC staff to provide El Dorado Hills Fire Department with full dispatch/communications services. If you need anything further from us, please don't hesitate to contact me.

The Board of Directors is considering adopting performance measurement goals to direct fire crew planning and to monitor the operation of the Department. These measures of time are designed to deliver outcomes that will save patients medically salvageable upon arrival and to keep small fires from becoming more serious. Such measures and goals provide the Department a foundation upon which future deployment decisions are based.

These deployment measurements include:

- DM 1 911 Call Handling Time
- DM 2 Turnout Time
- DM 3 Travel Time
- DM 4 Total Response Time
- DM 5 Effective Response Force Time

\*All times are collected using a combination of Active 911 and Crystal Reports. The times are provided with the best accuracy possible given the limitations of technology in our system. There is a time lag from when the dispatch center indicates that they alert a station to a call and when the station alerting activates. This lag time can skew the statistics.

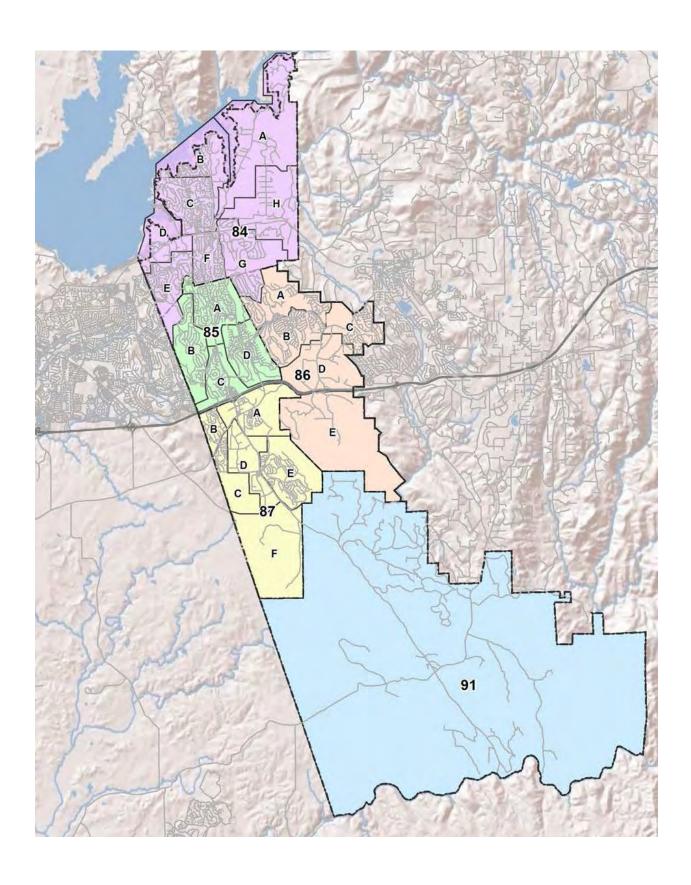

#### **Purchase of Wing Inflatable Rescue Raft**

#### **Summary:**

Over the last twelve-months the District has continued to provide training and equipment for the Districts Swiftwater/Lake Rescue Team (SWRT). This team has already been utilized several times during this winter's unprecedented rain/flooding including the successful rescue last month at Webber Creek.

Currently, the District is forced to rely on the City of Folsom when a water rescue requires the use of Rescue Boat to reach and retrieve victims. Most recently for example, a report of a missing Kayaker on the American River/Salmon Falls required Folsom to respond upriver from Folsom Lake.

If the Folsom resource is not available, crews would be required to hike into the victim delaying needed medical care.

The addition of a Rescue Boat to the District's Swiftwater Rescue Team is an important resource that can be utilized in winter for seasonal creeks and streams and during the summer on the American River and Folsom Lake.

The Boat will be housed at Station 84 on a trailer for quick response,
